Itinerary

Day 1: Arrival - Luxor East Bank Tours

in the morning our tour leader will meet you at your pick-up location to transfer you in a private air-conditioned vehicle to embark on the Miss Egypt Nile cruise from Luxor to Aswan and start your Magnificent vacation and explore the Luxor temple which The temple was dedicated to the Theban triad: the great god Amon-Ra, his wife Mut.

and visit a Cult temple dedicated to Amun, Mut, and Khonsu. The largest religious building ever constructed is the Karnak temple

Day 2: Luxor West Bank Tours

after having your breakfast, we will move to visit the temples of the west bank including <u>Hatshepsut Temple</u> also known as the temple of El-Deir El-Bahari is essentially a complex of mortuary <u>temples</u> and tombs, is was built by <u>Queen Hatshepsut</u>. The temple's unique design was made by the loyal architect Senmout.

After that, you will stop to see one of the most important sites of Luxor attractions facing the Nile River, the Colossi of Memnon are two massive monumental stone statues of Pharaoh Amenhotep.

the West Bank is a gateway to the Valley of the Kings, located in the center of the tombs. is considered as the burial of many different kings and queens, the most important of them is cavy 35 of king Amenhotep the second.

optional (Hot air balloon) then we will Sail towards Edfu and Kom Ombo temples.

Day 3: Edfu and Kom Ombo temples

After your Breakfast, you will visit the <u>Temple of Edfu</u> one of the largest temples in Egypt. the temple was built on top of older ruins dating back to Ramses III and was constructed over the course of 180 years under a variety of rulers

then have your lunch while sailing to Kom Ombo to see and explore the huge <u>Temple of Kom Ombo</u> that is dedicated to the two deities, is unique because it is, in fact, a double temple, dedicated to Sobek the crocodile god, and Horus the falcon-headed god.

then we will sail to Aswan and visit the high dam, Philae temple, and unfinished obelisk.

Day 4: Aswan Tour

In the morning, you will start the <u>Aswan tour</u> to visit the main source of electricity for the whole nation, Aswan <u>High Dam</u>, the <u>Greco-Roman temple</u> that was built to protect the country and for the worship of one of the most remarkable deities in ancient Egyptian Religion, the famous goddess Isis.

explore the magnificent <u>Philae Temple</u> the tiny island of Philae was famed for its beauty and was known as the "Pearl of Egypt'. Plants and palm trees grew from the fertile deposits that had collected in the crevices of the granite bedrock. The monuments of Philae include many structures dating predominantly to the Ptolemaic Period (332–30 BC).

<u>the Unfinished Obelisk</u> is a granite would-be monument that was never finished. It is one of the most important archaeological finds in Egypt for the insight it has provided into ancient stonemasonry methods.
