Day 1: Arrival / Casablanca

Our local driver guide will be waiting for you at Mohamed V Airport in Casablanca according to the flight schedule you've made. He will take you to the hotel where you'll check in and rest for an evening.

Day 2: Casablanca city Tour

After having a meal, your nearby driver is there to pick you up to start your tour. Throughout the tour, your local guide will tell you everything you need to know as he or she will accompany you. We will begin at the Hassan II Mosque, an architectural masterpiece. We will then go to the single Jewish museum in an Arab country; it traces the long history of Judaism in Morocco and its influence.

Lunch will be served, and then proceed with your guide to the Souk (Marketplace) to end our tour in Houbos.

Don't fail to enjoy Moroccan Art Deco in Casablanca's Habbous before you go to Marrakech. The night will be in Marrakech. The etymology of its name: Casablanca is known as Dar el-Baida in Arabic, which means White House (not like the one in the US). Originally, its first name was given as Anfa by the Phenicians. Marrakech will be the destination for the night.

Meals will consist of breakfast and lunch.

Day 3: Marrakech

One of these days you will have an opportunity to wake up and live in Marrakech; a dream come true for many, so ensure that when such a day comes you make it as special as possible.

Following your breakfast, our guide who is based in Marrakech will be together with his driver to guide you through your day tour of 'The Red City'. This place happens to be well known for quite a few things among which include Majorelle Garden named after one 'Jacques Majorelle', an artist from France, who put most of his effort and passion into it during his time."

Come to Jamaa El-Fna after you have eaten your lunch; a lively red square painted with various colored splashes. At "Chez Ali," dinner may be an option with folkloric dancers being performed in a Caidal tent. The more you know: Holy Marrakesh- kaa'ba of the Moroccans- is called "the land of the seven men" who were huge religious and Sufi scholars who gave their lives for knowledge and worship.
