After being picked up by our tour leader, let's see the first site Qadisha Valley, also known as "Wadi Kadisha," is a famous Christian monastery and tourist destination. Several monasteries may be found all around, as well as a lush green landscape and religious structures.

And you must visit the Gebran Museum in Bcharri to learn about the multi-talented Lebanese artist, Gebran Khalil Gebran. His museum, which was formerly a monastery, now has all of his writings, 440 paintings, and sketches, as well as his personal furnishings, possessions, and private library.

At the end of day head to the Cedars of God in Bcharri, or Arz Al Rabb in Arabic, is a prominent emblem of Lebanon's flag. The cedar tree signifies Lebanon's strength, power, and dignity across time.
