### **Day Trip to Kom Ombo and Edfu from Aswan**

The temple walls are adorned with inscriptions that offer significant insights into ancient Egyptian mythology, religion, and daily life during its era.

Next, you'll visit the Kom Ombo Temple, constructed between 1350 and 180 B.C. by order of Ramses II. Situated on the Nile's banks in the town of Kom Ombo, this temple honours Sobek, the crocodile-headed god, though the locals later shifted their worship to Haroeris, preferring not to venerate a malevolent deity.

After touring these historic sites, you'll be transported back to your hotel in Aswan, concluding your Kom Ombo and Edfu adventure.
