Luxor day tour to the monasteries

From the start of the day, you will be picked up from your hotel by an expert Cairo top tours tour leader and driven on private wheels to begin your trips.

Monastery of the Saints, Mount Todd, Luxor. The monastery of the saints of the two martyrs, Anba Beshay and Anba Bassantous is located east of Todd Armant, in the heart of the village cemetery.

The monastery church complex comprises the original church, four structures in one row, and two khors. The newer church consists of 12 domes, three buildings, and nine naves, dating back to the 18th and 19th centuries. The two chapels are constructed of mud bricks and are situated to the west of The church an ancient bathtub box.

Deir El-Shayeb, Luxor

The monastery of Anba Pachomius Al-Shayeb is about 6 kilometers from Luxor (the ancient city of Thebes) on the eastern mainland and 671 kilometers from Cairo. The ancient church is the only surviving ancient structure, dating back to the fourteenth century AD and reconstructed in the seventeenth century AD. Then you will be returned to the drop-off site, which will mark the conclusion of our service.
