Day 1: Luxor temple - Karnak temple

After meeting our knowledgeable tour guide at the Luxor International Airport with the Cairo Top Tours sign, you will be driven to the magnificent and potent Royal House Dahabyia on the first day of your trip from Luxor to Aswan. You will then have the opportunity to see:

Luxor Temple:

Numerous Egyptian pharaohs may have been crowned there, either in actuality or in theory (as was the case with Alexander the Great), and the Luxor Temple is devoted to the restoration of monarchy.

Karnak Temple:

In the ancient Egyptian language, Karnak, which translates as "the fortified city," is known as Abit Rust, which means "the most prestigious and reverent place." On the eastern bank of the Nile, this tiny Egyptian city is situated in the city of Luxor.

Have your lunch on the board. Then you will be offered to go to the Karnak [temple sound and light show](#), have dinner, and get a nice sleep.

Day 2: Continue Luxor attractions

from Luxor to Aswan on the second day of the Royal House Dahabyia. Enjoy a delicious breakfast on board before making your travel arrangements.

The Luxor hot air balloon trip is an optional tour that Cairo Top Tours tour leader will provide you with so you may start your day early with picturesque aerial views. then, following breakfast, begin with the first site:

The valley of kings:

The Valley of the Kings is located in the valley of a dry river on the west bank of the ancient city of Thebes (modern-day Luxor). However, this term is not correct because several non-royals and members of the royal family other than the kings were buried there as well, though they were high-ranking.

Hatshepsut temple:

Queen Hatshepsut constructed the monastery to carry out rites that would help her in the afterlife. The temple is made up of three terraces that rise and fall, connected by ramps.

Colosi of Memnon:

On the western bank of Thebes, now known as Luxor, lies the statue of Memnon. Numerous Pharaonic monuments in Luxor, one of the most popular tourist destinations, are connected to the ancient Egyptian civilization from thousands of years ago.

Spend a restful sleep on the stunning board to round off your day.

Day 3: Sail to Edfu and Kom Ombo

Begin the third day of your journey. From Luxor to Aswan, spend five days in the Royal House Dahabyia. After enjoying a delectable breakfast, set sail for Edfu and go to your first destination:

Edfu temple:

The Temple of Edfu, also known as the Temple of Horus, is situated in the city of Edfu, 123 km north of Aswan. It is among the most exquisite temples in Egypt.

Kom Ombo temple:

The discovery of the oldest pottery-making workshop in the ancient state, which dates back to the Egyptian Fourth Dynasty (2613–2494), when the pyramids were built, is one of the significant and valuable discoveries made in the city of Kom Ombo, according to archaeologist Ibrahim Suleiman. then have your lunch and sail all the way to Aswan.

Meals: breakfast, lunch, dinner.

Day 4: sail to Aswan

Day 4 of the Dahabyia royal family's journey from Luxor to Aswan. will start with breakfast so you can refuel in the morning before being driven to the first location.

Aswan High Dam:

The High Dam's reserved water area is a sizable man-made lake with the following features: Average lake width: 10 km; lake length: 500 km Storage capacity overall: 162 billion m³

Philae temple:

Notably, the island of Philae, which divides the Nile into two opposing channels in Aswan, is one of the most powerful forts along Egypt's southern boundaries. The high dam's construction then has your final night.
